Amendment vs. Amendment of the Whole

Does your board ever make a motion to amend or an amendment of the whole? What is the difference?

Some basics on amendments:

It is out of order when another has the floor. .

- Must be seconded
- Is debatable.
- Requires a majority vote

An amendment can insert or add words, strike out words or do both: strike out and insert new words

An amendment of the whole essentially replaces a large portion of verbiage or an entire document

Both an amendment and the amendment of the whole must be voted on, and, if approved, the main motion would then become a motion to approve the item as amended.

In Omaha, we use the amendment of the whole quite often. In fact, we made a City Council rule:

Amendment of the Whole/Substitute motion

A member of the Council may, during consideration of any item, make a motion to substitute an entire motion for another. This action requires a second. An affirmative vote of an Amendment of the Whole or substitute motion shall constitute approval of the item and does not require further votes or actions


